The Labour Battalions

The 10th Battalion

It is somewhat difficult to recount the activities of the several labour battalions as the remaining records are few and inconsistent. The 10th is the only battalion with a war diary.

The 10th Battalion

The first mention of the 10th Battalion comes in the Reading Mercury of 1st Jan 1916 when it was reported the 10th came to Reading in late December 1915 and 300 were billeted in the Oxford Road area around Brock Barracks which was their HQ over Christmas; the remainder having been sent home on leave. After Christmas they returned to Cambridge Barracks at Portsmouth.

Most divisions going to France had a labour battalion attached at divisional level, rather than being part of a Brigade but the 10th were not so allocated. At last in May 1916 the order came for them to move to France. Their war career began when they were mobilised at Cambridge Barracks on 7th May

Cambridge Barracks 9th May to 10th June 1916

According to their war diary the 10th battalion was formed on the 9th May 1916 by collecting together men who had been allocated to works companies of the Wiltshires and Royal Berks rather than other battalions. The works companies were listed as:-

Wiltshire Regiment:-

- 2 Lab Coy from Hillsea
- 3 Lab Coy from Coventry
- 9 Lab Coy from Fovant
- 10 Lab Coy from Hilsea

Royal Berkshire Regiment

- 2 Lab Coy from Portsmouth
- 3 Lab Coy from Portsmouth
- 6 Lab Coy from Portsmouth
- 8 Lab Coy from Portsmouth
- 9 Lab Coy from Portsmouth

They set up a travelling medical board to assess the men as they arrived and of 1116 men 96 were discharged

immediately as unfit, 154 were classified A and transferred to other home based units. The remaining 866 were classified as AA and deemed fit for overseas service.

The numbers of men overwhelmed the barracks, especially at mealtimes, so an application was put in to vacate Cambridge Barracks. This was approved on the 7th June and an advance party was sent off to inspect their new home at Fort Purbrick under the quartermaster Lt F C Dwight.

The first step was get the paperwork sorted for the men to be discharged and transferred. A hastily assembled headquarters staff, orderly room and company staffs set about the task. Then the fit men had to be inoculated and vaccinated. No sooner was this done than a large number went down with measles and had to be isolated. The planned drills and training had to be postponed and the men taken for route marches instead.

Brevet Lt Col J H Balfour of the Indian Army arrived on the 27th May to take command and Capt H A Lash was appointed Adjutant.

The battalion had been supplied with heavy draft horses as their transport but on the 27th May these were segregated and requisitioned for other purposes so a second batch was obtained. These were used to haul the baggage and supplies when the battalion marched out of Cambridge Barracks on the 10th June to move to Fort Purbrook. The date was originally set at June 7th but the outbreak of measles delayed the move.

Fort Purbrook 10th to 19th June 1916

On the 14th June they were informed that the Section III of the Portsmouth Defences, to which they were attached, had to be prepared to move to France immediately. They were still not up to full strength but on the 15th a detachment from the Royal Berks 11th Labour Company arrived. They had been attached to the 3rd Hants at Fort Comer. Technically this brought the battalion up to strength but there were still a large number off sick.

On the 16th 20 men from the 11th Battalion arrived with 77 men from other Royal Berkshire Labour Companies to make up the losses.

The battalion vacated Fort Purbrook on the 17th and,

with their transport, entrained at Cosham for Southampton Docks. Headquarters and the majority of the men marched off to a rest camp, leaving the transport and 50 men at the docks.

One of the men left behind was Private Edward Thomas Tudor (23213) who was suffering from Meningitis and he died on the 23rd.

Havre **18th to 21st June 1916**

The docks party embarked on the transport Astralind on the 18th and set off for Havre. they were followed on the night of the 19th by Headquarters and the rest of the battalion who had a very calm crossing on the transport Caesarea.

On arrival at Havre they marched off to Sauvic Camp to rejoin the transport.

The next day they entrained at Havre for Rouen.

Rouen **21st June to 31st December 1916**

At Rouen they were based at no 3 Labour Camp and came under the command of the Town Troops. Initially only Headquarters, A and B Coys were at the Labour Camp, at Quevilly with C and D Coys and the Transport section at a rest camp.

No 3 Labour Camp at Quevilly was described as 'an uncomfortable camp in a suburb'. Under the command of the Town Troops at Rouen they were employed on loading and unloading supplies from trains. These included wood, ammunition, food and all the other necessities of a modern army.

Rouen was one of the Base Ports for the western front and as well as serving as a major transport hub, it was also the site of a major military hospital and a rest camp for men withdrawn from the front.

They were first employed at the Army Ordnance Depot, unloading ammunition at Ammunition Wharf and handling stores at the Vase Supply Depot. They were divided up into gangs supervised by NCOs and subalterns and employed in shifts around the clock.

At the standing camp they were allocated three dining huts with tables and forms and meals were served continuously between 05:30 and 19:00. Great care was taken to ensure that those who had to sleep during the day were left undisturbed.

On the 17th July a party of 38 Labour men from the Royal Berkshire Regiment arrived seemingly unexpected under the command of 2Lt R G Cox. with one sergeant, one corporal and once lance corporal. After suitable enquiries they were accepted and included in the battalion's strength.

The pattern of round the clock work continued through July, August and September. The duties varied slightly as the different supply ships arrived but munitions, stores and petrol remained the mainstay, unloading from ships, stacking in stores and then loading trains. Mostly it was the Army Ordnance Corps they were working for but sometimes it was the Royal Engineers.

Around August 12th warm weather set in which made it very uncomfortable, especially for the men trying to sleep by day. The subalterns and NCOs set a good example and the men worked very hard but the conditions began to tell and many reported sick with diarrhoea. Also the animals were suffering badly. The hot spell came to an end on the 29th with tropical storms bringing rain, wind and thunder.

There was a problem with lice towards the end of August but by the 2nd September they were able to report that the steps taken had been effective.

On the 5th September the Officer Commanding the camp supplied the huts with plates and cups. There was one hut set up as an entertainment centre which put on concerts and other show and the several companies of the battalion organised a lot of their own entertainment.

Early in September the night shifts were reduced to 200 men and this was completely discontinued on the 30th.

Further improvements to the camp were effected in September. Huts were set aside for bathing and for washing and drying clothes. New deep drains were dug with pipe work made out of old petrol cylinders. Each tent was then provided with a drain filled with gravel and attached to the main drains by pipe.

On September 29th The Regimental Office, Quartermaster's Office and Store moved into huts, freeing up tent space which had become very overcrowded. As a result more tents were added and existing tents realigned by groups of men in their spare time.

By now the battalion was organised much more like an ordinary battalion and a battalion diagram was approved for the laying out of kits in the tents. After the chaos and overcrowding the bull-boys had taken over and men were expected to smarten up and behave as a soldier. One can imagine the reaction of many of the men.

In September it was decided that all transport sections in Rouen should be taken over by the 8th Artillery Horse Transport Company, to be returned only if the battalion was ordered to the front. This included animals, personnel and vehicles and they were duly handed over on September 21st in return for proper receipts after the vets had certified all the animals were in good condition. The battalion had however recovered its first batch of animals but as these had not been properly vaccinated and declared free from quarantine they were left with the battalion to be cared for by volunteers. The rest of the transport was taken off by the AHT to

another camp in the Rouen area.

Although the men were kept hard at work there was time for sports and relaxation and football competitions were organised at both a company and battalion level. There were church parades on Sunday and they were all kept fit by the occasional route march.

The nature of the work meant that men's uniforms were wearing out quickly, especially the trousers, and on Sept 25th permission was obtained for men to be supplied with a working dress of an old set of jacket, trousers, and boots.

2nd Lt R G Cox left the battalion in October to join the RFC on probation as an observer. He was followed at the end of December by Sergeant Day.

The new drainage system coped well with the torrential rains and wind but on the 22nd and 23rd October it all froze solid, including the water in the basins in the tents. The cold snap prompted the issue of a third blanket to all the men.

The long hours of work began to take their toll in October and steps were taken to reduce them to more reasonable times.

In November the working parties were detailed for the Base Supply Depot, The Detail Issue Store, the Timber Yard and the Dock. At the dock they were to unload ships and although there was lots of work pressure in the first half of the month, parties were often sent back to camp on standby as ships' arrivals had been delayed.

From November 15th to 18th it was very cold with hard frosts and snow. On the 25th and 26th it was very wet, and between the 27th and 30th it was foggy. This awful weather resulted in lots of coughs and colds and several men went down with influenza. One man was diagnosed as having cerebro-spinal-meningitis from which he later died.

A skills inventory was carried out in November and it was found that 413 men of the battalion were carrying out duties related to their civilian employment, as follows:-

Other men who had been mechanics in civil trade were tested in their trade skills.

On the 27th November the day was slightly reorganised. It now ran:-

Some further reinforcements arrived on the 29th November with a corporal and 19 privates from the 23rd Devon Works Battalion. A further draft of 2 lance corporals and 47 privates joined on the 19th December.

During December lectures were held on such varied topics as the History of Rouen and Venereal disease. The YMCA hut was well patronised. Christmas was appropriately celebrated with gifts from the Queen Alexandra Field Fund distributed.

1916 ended on a cold note with wintry weather throughout December.

Rouen

1st Jan to 8th May 1917

During January the pattern of working parties continued, mostly they were small and specialised but the party for the Base Supply Depot increased dramatically, with no less than 670 on the 31st January.

As a result of the skills inventory in November groups of men were identified for transfer to other units:-

- 3 mechanics went to the Heavy Branch of the Machine Gun Corps
- 20 wood cutters to 1st Army
- 7 crane drivers to Dunkirk
- 2 hammer-men to AOD Workshops at Le Havre

The bad weather continued. 43 tents which leaked had to be replaced. Water basins and taps froze or burst and the Seine was littered with ice floes which had broken away from the frozen marshes.

500 patched jackets and 250 patched trousers were obtained from AUD to replace worn out working suits in January. The lice problem reappeared so strict control over bathing was instituted to ensure every man had his bath at an appropriate time. It was while the man was bathing that his uniform could be deloused. The cold weather which caused most of the water supplies to freeze made it very difficult to allow for the washing of men and clothes.

The working patterns were amended in February with A Coy permanently assigned to work in connection with the discharge of ships under 2Lt F Fricker. More specialist tradesmen were assigned to other units,

- 12 carpenters at Detail Issue Stores, Rouen
- 17 wood cutters to 1st Army

13 mechanics to various locations

As it was winter the men were marching out to work and returning to camp in the dark and despite the long hours and awful weather managed to keep fit and cheerful although 6 cases of measles were reported in February.

On the 5th Feb a further reinforcement of 2 lance corporals and 78 privates arrived from the 13th Works Battalion of the Devonshires based at Saltash.

The Director of Labour, Brigadier General E Gibb visited the battalion on the 2nd March and Col Balfour was given the additional job of commanding the 15th Group of the Labour Corps on the 3rd March. He now had many other units and over 5000 personnel under his command. He took with him his adjutant, Capt H A Lash, to oversee the heavy administrative load of the Group.

The Camp was inspected by Brig Gen M Welch on the 5th March accompanied by the Base Commandant of Rouen.

In March further specialisation of tasks occurred. B Coy under 2Lt Grandin were added to A Coy at the docks under the overall management of 2Lt Fricker. They were managing to handle up to 7 tons per man per day. They established a record tonnage of 2783 tons on the 14th March only to beat it substantially with 3252 tons on the 15th. C Coy were specialised at the Detail Issue Stores and D Coy in train loading. A smaller group of 2 NCOs and 16 men were specialised in stevedoring work at the St Sebasticus Timber Yard working for the most part on loading and unloading barges on their own.

The cold weather with lots of snow and ice continued for most of March.

They seemed to have moved from no 3 Labour Camp to no 6 Labour Camp sometime in April

Col Balfour issued his Farewell Order on the 12th May. It read:-

FAREWELL ORDER

B.E. Force,

France, 12-5-1917

1. At Fort Purbrook, when about to embark for France, it was agreed that the Officers should associate themselves with the men, and that the former should do their utmost to help the men, also that the O.C, would say later, how that compact had been observed. the time has arrived to do so, The requirements of the Service necessitate certain reorganisation, but all for the present remain together in the same Group.

2. The compact has been more than observed by Officers and Other Ranks respectively. The Battalion has reached a high state of efficiency in discipline, work and comradeship-crime is practically non-existent. Tonnage records have been broken, and a good name earned in work and play.

It is impossible to thank individually those who have

contributed to this, for would be necessary to name, one and all of the Battalion, but undoubtedly the Officers have acted up to the old Service Motto-"MEN FIRST", and men have without a murmur willingly undergone the hardships of hard toil, in heat, cold, snow, and darkness, so as to keep their comrades supplied at the Front, and the OC has never for a moment wavered in his belief in the trustworthiness of the men in or out of Camp, and asks them to give the same support, in the future, as in the past 12 months, to the Captains commanding, and to quickly settle down in the new organisation under their Non-commissioned Officers.

3. Last Christmas the OC, sent a message to the Battalion, congratulating it in the progress made so far (towards the Light).

4. It is well to remember, that, results are not attained without effort on the part of all concerned, (the light of Duty) has been attained, but it has to be maintained, and Colonel Balfour will always be thankful that he has had an opportunity of assisting some 1200 good men to do their duty.

Transfer to the Labour Corps

The Labour Corps was formed at the Base Camp at Rouen in December 1916 and the 10th Battalion reported then to them. However it was not until May that the association with the Royal Berks was severed and the men formally transferred to the Labour Corps.

A new Director of Labour for the British Expeditionary Force was appointed in February and he took over operational control of the battalion. He visited the battalion on the 2nd March and effectively put all the Labour units in the Rouen area under the 10th Royal Berks' staff

The 10th Battalion was incorporated into the Labour Corps on the 9th May 1917. in accordance with ACI 611, becoming 158 and 159 Companies. 158 Coy renumbered men in the series 94201 to 94800 and 159 Coy used 94801 to 95400.

For the subsequent history of 158 and 159 Coy see section 146
